4. In Rev 19:11-13 describe what John saw (v11, 12, 13). What does each of these designations mean (v11, 12, 13)?

5. Using 19:14-16 describe who was following Jesus (v14). What further designations did Jesus have (v15-16) and how would He conquer the nations (v15)?

6. Looking at 19:17-21 who did the angel call for (v17) and why (v18)? What was this in anticipation of (v19) and what actually occurred (v20-21)?

7. According to 20:1-3 what did the angel from heaven do (v1-2) and for how long (v2-3)? What would this prevent (v3)? What would happen after this period (v3)?

8. Read 20:4-6. What 3 things will believers do in the millennium (v4, 6) and what blessing is given to them (v6)? What will happen to those who don't believe in Jesus (v5)? Apply.

9. From 20:7-10 what will happen after the 1000 year reign of Christ (v7) and why (v8)? What will be the outcome (v10)?

10. In 20:11-15 what will happen to the dead who are raised after the millennium (v11, 12-13, 15)? What will happen to death and Hades after this and what is this called (14)?

11. Looking back over Rev 19-20 pick out some of the most exciting things for you as a child of God. What basic weapon does Jesus use to dispose of Satan (v13, 15) and what how can we apply this today?

Life Group Questions—Pathway to Peace—Peace (Philippians 4:2-7)

(Using questions based on today's message, Life Groups meet in homes to build supportive relationships with others at Celebration Fellowship that enable us to grow in Christ.)

1. On a scale of 1-10 share how high or low your “peace meter” is right now. Why?
2. Read Philippians 4:2-7. Are there certain types of people (even Christians) that you get into conflict with easily? How do you deal with it if you have to be around them?
3. Describe the 2 ways people try to find peace—through the world, or through Christ.
4. Talk about how focusing on your circumstances or on your rights keeps you from having peace. How can you practically choose to focus on Jesus instead?
5. Discuss what it means to focus on Christ rather than control. Why is this a key to peace in our relationships?
6. What are some areas of worry that you typically have? How can apply the principles of latitude (everything) and attitude (thanksgiving) in prayer to resolve these? Use specific examples.
7. If there is time bring up anything else from the message that you would like to talk about.

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Easy As Pie

Introduction to Revelation 19-20

As the Geico gecko might say the victory of Jesus over Satan at the end of history is as easy as pie—there’s nothing to it. In Revelation 19-20 a fourfold hallelujah erupts in heaven after the overthrow of the world religious and economic system, Babylon the great. This signals the defeat of Satan, the avenging of the blood of the bond-servants of God, and the beginning of the reign of Christ. It is time for the marriage supper of the Lamb and His bride, along with those who have been invited to attend. For this to occur, however, the faithful and true Lamb must return on His white horse with His righteously robed followers to defeat the Antichrist—along with his coalition of the world’s armies. The weapon He uses to accomplish this is simply the sword that comes

from His mouth, the Word of God. In other words Christ’s victory at Armageddon is as “easy as pie”. First the Antichrist and false prophet are thrown into the lake of fire, then the rest are destroyed by the spoken sword of the Lamb. At this point our divine destiny as believers begins to unfold. After Satan is bound for a thousand years Christ ascends His throne to rule over the earth during this period. However, as God’s people we also will reign with Him. All the believing dead will be resurrected, and will both judge the nations and serve as priests to God. This will be possible because Satan will be bound and Christ will rule. It will certainly be a blessing to be part of this first resurrection because death will have no power

over us. At the end of the millennium, though, Satan will be set free, but only to allow the destruction of all evil. He will go forth to deceive the nations at that time, gather his followers together on a broad plain to battle the saints, but they will all be quickly destroyed by divine fire. Not only that, but the devil, death, and Hades will be thrown into the lake of fire to be tormented forever. Once God’s book of works is opened at His great white throne all the unbelievers will be thrown into the fire as well. It will all be “easy as pie”.
